

Labor Market Realities and Our Two-Tier Economy

Michigan has a two-tier labor market.

Workforce jobs fall into 22 major occupation categories. Of those, twelve are made up almost entirely of jobs that don't require a B.A. In the remaining ten occupations, a majority of jobs do require a college degree. The income differences between these two sets of occupation categories are dramatic.
